**Become a Poll Worker**

### **Qualifications:**

To work at the polls, you must:

- Be an eligible voter in the City of Neenah (an adult U.S. citizen who has resided in the City of Neenah for at least 21 days and not disqualified from voting)
- Attend training
- Pay close attention to detail
- Speak, read, write and understand English
- Be capable of performing each task at the polling place
- Work a full shift (6 am to 9 or 10 pm)
- Work well with others
- Perform duties in a non-partisan manner
- Abide by state and federal election laws
- Never engage in electioneering at the polling place
- Treat all voters with respect
- Treat Election Officials and Clerk's Office employees with respect
- Be free from the influence of alcohol and/or drugs while at the polls
- Not be a candidate for any office on the ballot for that election

### **Polling Place Assignments:**

Approximately four weeks prior to an election the Clerk's Office begins contacting Election Officials to fill vacancies for the upcoming election. You do not need to wait to hear from us, you can call the Clerk's Office 886-6100 to express your willingness to work.

**Training:**

*City of Neenah Election Officials are required to attend training before an election. The training sessions are held on the Thursday afternoon prior to the election at Neenah City Hall, 211 Walnut Street. November General Election trainings are held at the Neenah Library, 240 E. Wisconsin Avenue.*

**Compensation:**

*The City of Neenah pays its Election Officials a daily stipend of \$120 for Spring Elections & the Fall Primary and \$150 for November General Elections. Chief Election Officials receive a daily stipend of \$180 for Spring Elections & the Fall Primary and \$215 for November General Elections. For attending the pre-election training meeting you receive an additional \$20. Breakfast, lunch and dinner are included catered by one of Neenah's finest restaurants.*

**Regularly Scheduled Elections:****Spring Primary**

*Primary held on the third Tuesday in February to nominate non-partisan candidates to be voted for at the Spring Election. State Statute §5.02(22)*

**Spring Election**

*Election held on the first Tuesday in April to elect judicial, educational and municipal officers and non-partisan county officers and to express preferences for the person to be the presidential candidate for each party in presidential election years. State Statute §5.02(21)*

**Fall Primary**

*Primary held in even-numbered years on the second Tuesday in August to nominate candidates to be voted for at the General Election. State Statute §5.02(18)*

**General Election**

*Election held in even-numbered years on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November to elect United States senators, representatives in congress, presidential electors, state senators, representatives to the assembly, district attorneys, state officers other than the state superintendent and judicial officers and county officers other than supervisors and county executives. State Statute §5.02(5)*
