Off Street Parking Rules for Residential Properties

The rules detailed below are found in the Neenah Municipal Code Section 26-550.

What you can park and where you can park it-----

No parking on grass

All automobiles (cars, trucks & vans) parked outside, must be parked on a graveled or paved driveway surface and must be licensed and operable.

3 vehicle limit in front setback

Not more than 3 total vehicles, one of which may be a Recreational Vehicle, may be parked in the required front yard and all must be on a graveled or paved driveway surface.

Seasonal parking of large RV's on driveways

A single "Large Recreational Vehicle" may be parked in the required front setback area only between April 15 and November 15 on a graveled or paved driveway surface.

Rear and side yard parking of boats, campers and other RV's

No more than 3 "Recreational Vehicles" may be parked in the side or rear yards, one of which may be a Large Recreational Vehicle. The "Large Recreational Vehicle" must maintain a minimum 3 feet setback from all property lines and must be parked on a graveled or paved surface.

Commercial vehicle parking

No commercial vehicle with a weight in excess of 8000 pounds, over 20 feet in length, or having a height of more than 8 feet, shall be parked or stored in a residential district, except when rendering a service.

Temporary Storage Containers (PODS & dumpsters)

A single "Portable Storage Container" (PODS) may be used for not more than 30 days, must maintain a minimum 10 feet setback from all property lines including sidewalks, shall be no larger than 8 feet wide by 16 feet long by 8 feet high and shall not be placed on public streets or sidewalks without prior approval of the city. Dumpsters used during construction are limited to 2, must maintain a minimum 10 feet setback from all property lines including sidewalks and must be removed immediately upon completion or cessation of construction.

Recreational Vehicles defined (see flip side for diagram)

Recreational Vehicle

"Recreational Vehicle" means a utility trailer, or any other motorized or non-motorized vehicle, other than passenger vehicles and trucks, primarily manufactured for the expressed purpose of providing recreational activities, including but not limited to motor homes, trucks with camper shells, and unmounted camper shells, camper & travel trailers, horse trailers, all terrain vehicles, boats, jet skis, snowmobiles, ice shanties and any trailer used to transport recreational vehicles.

Recreational Vehicle, Small

"Small Recreational Vehicle" means any recreational vehicle, including any trailer used for transport, that in total does not exceed any of the following dimensions: height of 7 feet, length of 20 feet, or width of 10 feet. A trailer carrying multiple vehicles is considered a single unit.

Recreational Vehicle, Large

"Large Recreational Vehicle" means any recreational vehicle, including any trailer used for transport, that in total exceed any of the following dimensions: height of 7 feet, length of 20 feet, or width of 10 feet. A trailer carrying multiple vehicles is considered a single unit. RV's over 40 feet in length are not allowed.
