Message from Mayor Dean Kaufert

Dear Friends,

A sign hangs in my office, an anniversary present from my wife, Renee, that reads "Neenah: There's no place I'd rather be." That sums up my feelings about the City. I hope you feel the same way.

As I write this article, the temperature is hovering in the mid-80s and the humidity is high. As I'm out and about in the community, I can tell you that optimism about Neenah is also high. We continue to be a place where people want to live and to visit. Everyone enjoys the wonderful goings-on in our community.

This summer has been full of activities for young and old. I make an effort to attend many of our community events and spend time visiting with you: Wednesday Night Concerts and Thursday Afternoon Music in Shattuck Park, Community Band concerts, StreetBall, Memorial Day and Fourth of July parades, and the CommunityFest Celebration at Riverside Park along with the fireworks display.

Other happenings this summer include the reading program at our Library. The "We Soar" summer library program had great numbers of children participating. The swimming pool was also a popular place to be in July! The Neenah Summer Fun Runs, held on Sunday nights and put on by volunteers, drew large crowds to Memorial Park. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping Neenah "A Great Place to Live!"

For your convenience, the City offers a disposal drop-off site to assist you in keeping your neighborhood tidy. The City Garage drop-off site, located at 1495 Tullar Road, is open Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Employees are available to direct you. The site is also open on Saturdays through November 14, from 8:30 until noon. The site is staffed by Aldermen and the Mayor on those Saturdays. The drop-off site accepts yard waste, leaves, and brush. Large items, metal, and cardboard are also accepted. Please let your Aldermen and Alderwomen know that you appreciate the time they spend assisting at the drop-off site.

Recycling news

Fall Leaf Collection

Leaf collection begins the week of October 14. Please check the 2015 *Recycling and Refuse Guide* or the City's website www.ci.neenah.wi.us for the fall leaf collection dates in your area. All leaves must be loose on the terrace. No plastic bags or containers of leaves will be collected. Do not rake leaves or grass into the street.

Residential Asphalt Shingles

The Winnebago County Solid Waste Facility, 100 W. County Road Y, Oshkosh, will accept residential asphalt shingles for recycling at a cost of \$30/ton. Shingles must be asphalt (non-asbestos), must come from residential dwellings (4 units or less), and must be free from cedar

shake, wood, metal and other residential trash/debris. For questions, contact the Solid Waste Facility at 920-232-1800.

Electronics Recycling Event

On Saturday, October 17, the City will hold an electronics recycling event at the City Garage, 1495 Tullar Road, from 8:00 a.m. until Noon. A fee will be charged for some items. For questions, contact the Public Works Department at 920-886-6240.

Saturday Morning Drop-Off Hours

The City Garage drop-off is open Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Saturday mornings from 8:30 a.m. until noon. Saturday hours continue through November 14.

Water Department

Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and Water Treatment

The Wisconsin DNR is responsible for establishing and enforcing most water quality, operation, and maintenance rules for the Water Utility in Neenah, and throughout the state. Laws regulating water utilities are found in Wisconsin Statutes in the Natural Resources (NR) chapter.

Chapter NR 809. Addresses water quality issues such as maximum contaminant levels for a variety of organic and inorganic chemicals, allowable levels of lead and copper, control of disinfection and related by-products, requirements for filtration, criteria for the annual consumer confidence report, and public notification of violations.

Chapter NR 810. Covers the maintenance required at both the water treatment plant and the water

distribution system.

Chapter NR 811. Defines the design and operational criteria for the processes in the water treatment plant, including pumping, chemical feed, softening, ultra violet light disinfection, activated carbon feed, zebra mussel control, reservoir storage, elevated tower storage, hydrants, and water main.

All significant changes at the water treatment plant and in the distribution system must first be approved by the DNR before they can be implemented. In addition, monthly operational reports, and periodic sampling for chemicals and microbiology must be submitted to the DNR for review.

Deer Kills

Thanks to new legislation in Wisconsin, drivers who strike and kill a deer are no longer required to notify law enforcement to claim the deer. However, prior to collecting the deer they must report it to the

Department of Natural Resources (DNR) by calling 608-267-7691. If the driver doesn't wish to claim the deer, others may, but the call to the DNR must still be made PRIOR to moving/taking the deer. Bear and turkey kills are still required to be tagged by law enforcement in order to be claimed.

Wanted: Responsible animal owners!

Our Police Department investigates dozens of animal bite and stray animal complaints each year. So far in 2015, about

25 animals have been declared "dangerous" or "potentially dangerous."

And the vast majority of those were found to be unlicensed.

If you are a dog or cat owner, please be responsible by

- Keeping dogs leashed or fenced. when outdoors



- Cleaning up after your pet.
- Keeping your pet quiet, especially at night.
- Licensing your pet every year. All cats and dogs are required to have a license. Pet licenses can be obtained at the Treasurer's Office at City Hall, Monday through Thursday 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Friday 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Call the Treasurer's Office for more information: 920-886-6145.

Fall Safety Tips for School

As children return to school this fall, it's important to keep in mind simple safety practices:

- Be aware of school zones and reduce speed to 15 mph in those areas. Remain alert and remove all possible driving distractions—**specifically cell phone use. Don't text and drive!**
- If your child walks or rides a bike to school, remind him to obey crossing guards, to never accept a ride from a stranger, and to develop a buddy system with another child.
- When cooler weather arrives, make sure your child has proper clothing for the day. Warm hats, gloves, and boots are often necessary, even in fall. Frostbite and hypothermia are medical conditions that can manifest quickly.
- Kids are very active at school. Make sure your child eats a good breakfast, which will sustain energy and allow him to remain focused for the entire morning.

Did you know...

Neenah-Menasha Fire Rescue is responsible for making sure all *underground storage tanks (UST)* and *above-ground storage tanks (AST)* in the cities of Neenah and Menasha are installed and removed safely.

NMFR performs annual inspections for all *non-retail UST* and *AST* tanks within the cities of Neenah and Menasha, while the State of Wisconsin is responsible for all *retail UST/AST* tanks. NMFR must adhere to the State of Wisconsin statutes and codes to ensure environmental and fire safety. The inspection process includes leak detection, corrosion control and fire safety of all tanks.


Create Memories at Your Museum
