
Bushes + Intersections = Danger

Do you live on a corner? If so, you may not be aware that there is a special area on your lot known as the "Vision Clearance Triangle". This area is regulated to provide safe and adequate conditions for pedestrians and vehicles at intersections. The "Vision Clearance Triangle" is defined as an unoccupied triangular space at the street corner of a corner lot. The triangle is formed by connecting the point where each right of way line intersects and two points located twenty five (25) feet along each right of way line. In this area, there should be no visual obstructions, except trees trimmed to the trunk, between a height of 3 feet and 10 feet that would create a blind spot to vehicle, bicycle or pedestrian traffic". Height measurement shall be taken from top of street curb or road edge where curbs are not provided. Homeowners should be diligent through out the summer growing season to keep bushes and trees in this area properly trimmed. As most accidents occur at intersections, it is important that we all work to make them safe.
