**Re: Train vs. Pedestrian Collision (additional details)**

The investigation into the train vs. pedestrian collision on North Lake Street continues. Lake Street and the Canadian National railroad tracks both run essentially north/south at this location, and they meet at an acute angle. There are two sets of tracks at this at-grade crossing.

Preliminary information shows the pedestrian had been a passenger in a vehicle headed southbound on Lake Street. The vehicle had stopped for a northbound train at the crossing. The pedestrian wanted to get to a location on the other side of the crossing, and chose to leave the car and approach on foot. He climbed through the stopped northbound train and exited to the other side, where there is a second set of tracks. The pedestrian was struck by a second train approaching southbound.

All information suggests the warning devices at the crossing were working properly. These include overhead and roadside flashing lights, bells, and gates.

The injured pedestrian is identified as:

Timothy C. Miller, a 28-year-old Menasha resident. He remains hospitalized at ThedaCare Regional Medical Center – Neenah.
