#### Yard Waste Collection Schedule

#### **Weekly Spring Yard Waste Collection** April 12 to May 16, 2022

Starting April 12 the Department of Public Works will be collecting yard waste weekly. Collection will be the day following your regularly scheduled refuse collection. (See Yard Waste and Brush Guidelines below)

#### **Monthly Yard Waste & Brush Collection** June 6 to November 21, 2022

Starting June 6 the Department of Public Works will be collecting vard waste and brush monthly. Depending on the amount of yard waste and brush, the collection in an area may take more than one day. Residents who hire a tree cutting service or landscaper will need to make arrangements with the contractor to dispose of the yard waste.

#### Yard Waste and Brush Guidelines

- All yard waste and brush must be placed curbside by 6:30 AM of collection date.
- All vard waste must be in 35 gallon garbage cans with handles, bushel baskets, or smaller containers which weigh less than 50 pounds. You may use 30 gallon biodegradable paper bags. Do not use plastic bags or cardboard boxes for yard waste.
- Hedge Trimmings, Garden Debris, and Fine Brush should be placed loosely in 30 gallon biodegradable paper bags or cans and baskets not to exceed 35 gallons in size and 50 pounds in weight. Do not place in cardboard boxes or plastic garbage bags.
- Small Amounts of Brush should be bundled, 2 feet in diameter by 4 feet long, and tied with heavy cord (not wire) or placed in 30 gallon biodegradable paper bags or placed loosely in cans.
- Large Amounts of Brush up to 3 inches in diameter should be kept long and placed adjacent to the street with the cut ends facing the same direction as traffic flow would be for your side of the street.

#### **Drop-Off Center Punch Card**

Watch your mail in February 2022 for the Drop-Off Center Punch Card. The punch card will be your identification to use the drop-off center. It will provide 5, no charge drop-offs for items, such as garbage, large items and small quantities of concrete and dirt. Additional drop-off center punch cards are available at City Hall, 211 Walnut St. in the Department of Public Works, 3rd Floor or online. The cost is \$25. Residents are asked to please bring their used punch card with them.

Residents bringing leaves, brush, recyclables, cardboard, and yard waste, will need to bring their punch card as their identification even though these items do not require a punch.

#### What Items Are Accepted At The Drop-Off Center

- Shredded Paper (paper bags only)

#### **ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED**

- Freon appliances
- Electronics (DVD's, VCR's, Cellphones)
- Computer Equipment
- TV's
- Shingles, Tires, Oil Filters
- Grass Clippings

#### Large Items & Metal Curbside Pick Up


The City of Neenah offers large item & metal pick up curbside on the even months of the year (February, April, June, August, October and December). Large items include furniture (sofas, chairs, tables, etc.) mattresses, carpeting (cut to 3 feet wide and rolled), doors, windows and small amounts of bundled lumber (no longer that 4 feet). Extra bags of refuse and smaller items that would normally fit in your city issued refuse cart will not be picked during this time.

Residents must contact the City by calling **920-886-6251** or on-line at ci.neenah.wi.us/public-works for pick up of large items and metal. Items should be placed curbside **by 6:30 AM** on the Wednesday listed below, but no more than 24 hours before.

**NOTE:** If your refuse, recycling, yard waste, brush, metal, or large items are on the curb earlier than 24 hours before your scheduled collection, they may be removed by the City and the property owner may be charged a minimum of \$105 special collection fee.

#### **AUTOMATED COLLECTION**

#### Things to Know


- See map on page 7 for your collection day.
- Recycling is collected every other week. See map on page 7 and calendar on page 8.
- During holiday weeks, collection may be delayed by 1 day. See calendar on page 8.
   Please note - if your refuse/recycling day is normally on Friday, your pick up may be Saturday during a holiday week.
- Overflow refuse or recycling placed next to or on top of your cart will not be collected. Covers must close.
- Carts are property of the City of Neenah. If you move, leave the cart at the address.
- Do not place yard waste, large items/metal, hazardous materials or leaves in your refuse or recycling cart.
- Residents may occasionally find their carts are not emptied completely. Although efforts are always made to empty carts completely, overfilling the cart makes emptying difficult.
- Residents who have excess refuse/recycling may bring it to the Drop-Off Center. Residents are allowed to bring 2 bags to the drop-off center with no punch on their Punch Card.
- Contact the City at 920-886-6240 to request a cart exchange. A fee of \$25 per cart will be charged. No charge for new owners.
- Residents can request an additional 95 gallon cart for an annual fee of \$185 for a refuse cart and \$25 for a recycling cart by contacting the Public Works Department at 920-886-6240 or by visiting the Public Works website page at www.ci.neenah.wi.us

#### **Cart Placement Guidelines**

- Place carts curbside no later than 6:30 AM on your day of collection.
- Place your cart at the curb with the front of the lid facing the street with a minimum of 3 feet between each cart, mailbox, vehicle, utility pole, or any other object.
- Carts must be removed from the curb within 24 hours of collection
- If terrace is too narrow to place the cart without obstructing your sidewalk, place your cart on your driveway apron.
- Do not place carts in the street.
- Improperly placed carts can not be collected.
- Keep carts 3 feet apart to allow room for automated equipment.
- Keep carts 3 feet from other objects, e.g., trees, poles, mailboxes, and parked cars.
- Place carts with arrow pointing towards the street

#### Winter Placement

- After a snow storm, the best location for your cart(s) is on your driveway apron after you have cleared your snow.
- You could also place your cart(s) on a cleared area on the street side of your terrace, but they must be 3 feet apart.

#### Accept

- Newspapers & inserts
- Cardboard & paperboard (food boxes)
- Milk, juice & soup cartons
- Junk mail & catalogs
- Office & school paper
- Phonebooks, softcover books, hardcover books & magazines

#### **Do NOT Accept**

• Tissue paper & gift wrap



UNCONTAMINATED RECYCLING REDUCES COSTS

#### Things to Remember

- · Place all recyclables loose in your cart
- Newspaper, magazines, recyclable paper, etc. can be placed in paper grocery bags
- Plastic bags harm the sorting equipment and should be recycled at local retail locations that accept plastic bags and film (for more information see www.plasticfilmrecycling.org)
- Flattening boxes will give you more room in your cart
- Empty and rinse all bottles and containers
- Remove, rinse and replace all plastic screw caps
- No need to remove labels
- Metal jar lids are recyclable
- Recycling collection is bi-weekly. See map on page 7 and calendar on page 8 for recycling day in your area.

#### **Plastic**

#### Accept

- All plastic bottles, cups & containers
- Household bottles, jars & jugs
- Dairy containers & lids
- Produce, bakery & deli containers & lids

#### Do NOT Accept

- Plastic bags, wrap or film
- Motor oil bottles
- Styrofoam

#### Metal

#### Accept

- Aluminum bottles & cans
- Steel, tin & bi-metal cans

#### **Do NOT Accept**

- Aluminum pans or foil
- Empty paint cans
- Large/bulky scrap metal items
- Empty Aerosol Cans (place in regular refuse cart)

#### Glass

#### Accept

Food & beverage bottles & jars

#### **Do NOT Accept**

- Window glass
- · Ceramics or china
- Drinking glasses

#### **Fall Leaf Collection**

All leaves must be loose on the terrace. **No plastic bags or containers of leaves will be collected.** This schedule is subject to delay due to weather conditions and will continue until weather prohibits (snow or ice) or the last scheduled collection day in your area, whichever comes first. To avoid polluting storm sewers and to prevent traffic hazards, **do not rake leaves into the street**. Leaf collection in each area may take multiple days. (See area map on page 3)

The dates listed below are only a guide, weather will dictate the actual pickup.

If weather permits, there will be an additional non-scheduled pass through the City starting November 21. If weather prevents the City from completing the leaf collection, residents are responsible for disposal.

#### **Household Hazardous Waste**

The Winnebago County Household Hazardous Materials Collection Facility is located at 105 W. County Road Y, Oshkosh, 920-232-1800 or online at www.WinnebagoCountySolidWaste.com.

Acceptable materials include disinfectants, cleaners, solvents, aerosols, herbicides, insecticides, fungicides, weed killers, poisons, gasoline, transmission fluids, varnish, stain, thinners, light ballasts, household batteries, mercury, fire extinguishers and any household materials labeled: "Caution", "Warning", "Flammable", "Combustible", "Danger", "Corrosive".

#### **Electronics and TV's**

E-waste (TV's, VCR's, DVD players, computer equipment, etc.) is NOT picked up curbside or accepted at the Tullar Road Drop-Off Center. The City will hold two, Saturday E-Waste events. The events will be at the Neenah City Garage at 1495 Tullar Rd from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM on **May 14, 2022, and October 22, 2022**. Fees may apply.

Residents may also recycle unwanted or obsolete E-Waste items at the Winnebago County Landfill located at 105 W. County Rd Y, Oshkosh, WI. Call 920-727-2884 for more information. Residents may also contact Recycle That Stuff, Appleton at 920-955-3760. Fees may apply.

#### **Grass Clippings**

The City will not collect grass clippings. For a fee, you may dispose of grass clippings at the Winnebago County Landfill (920-232-1800), 100 W. County Road Y, Oshkosh. Biodegradable 30 gallon paper bags may be left at the landfill. All other bags must be removed. Landfill hours: Mon.-Fri. 7:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m., Sat. 7:00 a.m.-12:00 Noon.

#### Medications

Residents can dispose of unwanted or expired medications at the Neenah Police Station, 2111 Marathon Avenue and the Oshkosh Safety Building, 420 Jackson St., Oshkosh. Empty all pills into sandwich-sized sealable bags. Keep all liquids, creams and powders in original containers. Cross-off name and address. The drop-off box is available 24/7 and is safe, secure, convenient and anonymous.

# What do I do with latex paint?

Latex paint is not considered hazardous and not collected at this facility. It can be disposed of with your household trash when the paint is dry. To speed up the drying process, add sand, cat litter or latex paint hardener to the liquid paint.

# What do I do with alkaline batteries?

Alkaline batteries are not considered hazardous and not collected at this facility. Alkaline batteries may be placed in your household trash for disposal.

### **Accepted Household Materials**

Many of the household materials accepted are labeled as corrosive, poison, flammable or combustible. Examples include:

Products are provided as-is with no guarantee of integrity or effectiveness. Product Exchange is open during collection hours.

#### Other Materials

Light bulbs, rechargeable batteries, ballasts, used motor oil, oil absorbents & filters, antifreeze, auto batteries, tires, electronics, TVs, appliances and propane cylinders from Winnebago County households are accepted at the Winnebago County Landfill, 100 W. Cty Rd Y, Oshkosh. Charges and restrictions may apply.

**Hazardous waste from distributers, business use, farm use, out-of-county sources,** radioactive materials, infectious/medical wastes, asbestos, and medications <u>are not accepted</u> at the Winnebago County Landfill or Household Hazardous Material Collection Facility. Call for other options.


