# Neenah Rules Concerning Poultry



Residents keeping poultry are required to register with the City Inspections Department



No more than four total poultry may be kept per property



Poultry are allowed on single-family properties only



All poultry coops and yards shall be kept in a clean, sanitary condition and free from all objectionable odors and shall be subject to the inspection and approval of the Building Inspector



Poultry shall be provided with a covered enclosure and must be kept in the covered enclosures or a fenced enclosure at all times



The enclosure shall be located no closer than 25 feet of any neighboring home



No roosters allowed



No slaughtering of poultry allowed
